Indiana, in 1837, had tho langeat amount of circulation and of specie in proportion to its capital, of any state in tho Union. George Tucker, The Theory of Monty and Bank, etc. (Boston, 1839.) prised the eastern members by making a proposal, with which Gallatin concurred, in favor of immediate resumption of specie payment. He succeeded in his mission and set August 13, 1838, as the day on which the banks were to begin again the payment of specie. But the banks still feared the specie would all be gathered in the East, and on November 19, 1839, the State Bank again closed its specie vaults, not to reopen them until ordered to do so by the legislature, June 15, 1842. The Bank never defaulted again. No other state in the Union passed through this...
